### Introduction

Thank you for choosing MAPS.

MAPS is a powerful tool for your school and will form a crucial part of your eAssessment strategy, facilitating best practice right across the curriculum. This guide is designed to provide you with all the information that you need to operate and exploit MAPS at your school.

For those who are new to MAPS we have also produced the MAPS Quick Start Guide, which provides the essential information to get you going. ### What is MAPS?

*Developed closely with teachers and LA advisors, MAPS is a robust web application designed to save teachers time and make assessment more effective and manageable.*

MAPS - Managed Assessment Portfolio System – is an online portfolio and assessment system, accessible 24 hours a day all year round from school or home. Teachers can create, assign and mark assessment tasks and students can complete those tasks and store their work within their own portfolio on TAG Learning's secure server. Teacher and student information and data are kept secure and individual accounts are protected by unique usernames and passwords.

MAPS facilitates Assessment for Learning by providing the means to assess process as well as the product of the student's learning. The inbuilt messaging system within MAPS which allow students and teachers to discuss their activities and so feedback into the learning process

It is an ideal platform for moderation across the school and LA. The students can see at the touch of a button their assessment objectives and teachers can comment on student's work as it progresses. Moderation notes can also be attached so that teachers can choose to show teachers across the school and even across LAs how that work was moderated.

### **MAPS Usernames and Passwords**

Your Head Teacher, Heads of Department, Teachers and Advisors will be given a login to MAPS comprising the following:

**Username: Email address**

**Password: portfolio8**

When a user logs on to MAPS for the first time they will be asked to change their password.

When students log on for the first time their details for the default interface are:

**Username: Firstname\_Surname**

**Password: profile**

If students are using the Basic Interface their login will be

**Username: Firstname\_Surname**

**Password: abc**

Students logging into the basic interface at home will use:

**Username: Firstname\_Surname**

**Password: abcabc**

Usernames are not case sensitive but **passwords are**. Students will need to change their password and are encouraged to use something memorable.

### Operating system and browser compatibility

#### Compatibility

All users of MAPS access the resources using a web browser. We aim to make MAPS as compatible with the technologies used in web browsers as possible. To ensure that your experience of using MAPS is the best, we make the following recommendations with regard to compatibility:



Windows Computers: Internet Explorer 7.



Macintosh and Windows Computers: Mozilla Firefox (all versions).

MAPS will work with other browsers, or other versions of browsers but ultimate compatibility is not assured and so no other recommendations are currently made.

These compatibilities apply to browsers used in the respective institution and also to the browsers used by pupils and students if they continue their assignments at home.



MAPS is compatible with Windows and Macintosh OS X.

Certain resources within MAPS may require Adobe/Macromedia Flash Player 6 (or higher) and Adobe Reader (formerly known as Acrobat Reader) are installed in your web browser. These are already installed on most web browsers but if yours does not feature them, you may need to download them. This is a simple and, for the most part automated task (follow the links below), but you may need to seek assistance from your computer system administrator or ICT Coordinator. Subject to the rules at your institution, some computer networks may need a network administrator (usually the ICT coordinator) to allow downloading.

MAPS is offered in three versions:

- **Primary Edition:** optimised for the needs and resources of primary schools and young learners.
- **Standard Edition:** optimised for secondary schools and secondary school students.
- **eQualification Edition:** designed to meet the needs of eQualifications.

For the resources offered in these editions please refer to the Appendix to this User Guide.

Versions are entirely compatible and it is possible to transfer data seamlessly between them. It is also possible to add the functionality of any version to another.
